 - \$26.72 pay on line

Fundraising - Computers

- Info from Lana re: possibility to lease Chromebooks (rather than purchase) to save \$
- Summary of e-mails below & discussion:
 - Cannot lease, must purchase outright
 - Donate \$ to school & ask them to purchase from supplier

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- How many classrooms/kids have access to devices?
 - Grade 5 & 6s each have their own device, supplied by TDSB
 - Probably 20% of devices are at end of life
 - A little over 190 computers, LY had 210 students each with their own computer
 - Don't need to replace grade 5-6 devices, TDSB will provide those
 - FYI ~30 devices @ \$450 each = \$13,500
- I received the answer to your questions from our IT department and no, we cannot lease Chromebooks. They have to be purchased through our IT catalogue and they come from a Compugen vendor. I have the name of the model for this year and can assist in making a purchase, as I have access to their site and our internal catalogue.
- Please let me know if I can help in any way. The IT reply is below.

- Short version is Yes, these devices must be purchased through the catalogue from Compugen.
- Longer version:

Email one:

- As a Publicly Funded Organization (PFO) in Ontario there a regulations and guidelines that must be followed for any purchasing especially that with a significant cost.
- Our computer technology including Chromebooks is part of that. There is a tender and contract procedure which binds us to the selected vendor for the duration of the contract.
- Currently for Chromebooks that is Compugen. The vendor is then also under contract to offer the required volume of agreed upon units and at a fixed cost and service level.
- So yes any Board purchases to need to be from our catalog and from Compugen. Leasing is not an option in the contract, but also they have such a short lifespan and little aftermarket values, that you would be paying near full cost to not own the device outright.
- In addition to the legal ramifications, please understand the difficulty of having similar Chromebook units from different vendors, which would then have different warranty practices and possibly different warranty terms. This would become very problematic to manage.
- Additionally, for management (device tracking, updates, etc.) of the Chromebook devices we use Google Management and One2One Manager. There are licensing fees for these services that are built into the purchase cost as listed in the catalog. An outside device would require an individual license to be purchased separately, so if the individual on the parent council believes they can find a cost savings, they do need to add at least \$50 to the cost of external units for this licensing if doing a fair comparison.

• Chromebooks cannot be leased.

In order to purchase Chromebooks that can be supported by TDSB, we suggest the parent council donates the funds raised towards purchasing Chromebooks for the school via this page: <u>https://www.tdsb.on.ca/TechAccessAll/DeviceAccess</u>

Under the "Supporting 1:1 Device Access", they can click on donate now and complete the form. They can make a donation to a specific school to help boost their funding for technology, that way the devices will be supported by TDSB.

 - School Council can support grade 5/6 fundraising do yearly rather than every 2 years
 - Students & teachers are participating in AIA Christmas Boutique to fundraise
 Led by Mr. B (Grade 5), Miss Carrie (Grade 6)
 - Plan was to donate to a charitable cause; instead save for trip NY?
 - Is decision for kids & teachers to make

Fundraising – School Council plan vs. school budget

- School's budget spending is at Principal's discretion
- E.g. gave juice box, brownie & Rice Krispy treat to avoid kids bringing allergenic treats to school
- School Council/parents & teachers work with Gary to decide what to spend school budget on
- Teachers have already been telling Gary what they want for the budget
 - Last year gave each classroom \$400, and overall \$5000 for professional development
 - E.g. classroom items: glue sticks, paint, chart paper (consumables)
 - Or can be sports equipment, toys, items for specific student interests
 - Paper is bought by office & centrally available for teachers
- School Council needs to come to Gary with parent recommendations for spending
 - Jason, Jen, Abi, Samira + any others to provide input

Holiday hoopla: winter holiday event

- Dec 14, will be a talent show, kids are very excited about it and are auditioning
- School Council to discuss with Gary how to best support e.g. with snacks Jeff & Samira

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- No funds available from previous school council, unknown what's in The Lighthouse Foundation's bank account
- From community event (not TDSB/IPS SC funds): \$1416.07 June event + \$76.18 interest = \$1492.25

- The followings were my takeaways:
 - TDSB is really focusing on post-COVID mental health of the students
 - Importance of JOY in school. Engagement. Belonging. Well-being projects and themes
 - Early Reading supports to schools
 - Math is focus. Unlocking fractions, digital math tools and mathematical teaching promotions are and should be the focus of the principal and teachers
 - There is an achievement chart available for each child?
 - Each teacher should by now know their student's reading level? (ask at parent night)
 - TDSB recently has hired 4 coaches and 38 early intervention teachers (ask Ms. Lana?)
 - Resources are available for parent councils and parents at torontopiac.com. Melanie and Corine are new Co-chairs determined to connect the schools and share ideas and support one another.
 - Two other ways they suggested we connect are Facebook: ward 9 PIAC and GTA school councils
